The high school:

- · There is no class but levels students do not have the same classes according to their level in each subject.
 - · They work on computers.
- · There are "Study rooms" in the school which allows you to work in a group outside the classroom.
- · The high school is totally different, laptops are allowed in class except in some where there is a sign indicating it.
 - · Students can be absent for 5 minutes to go out.
- · Classes usually end at 2:30 p.m. and they have a 15-minute break between each class but they only have 30 minutes to eat, there is no ringtone to indicate the end of classes. Each level has a different time to eat but big meals happen from 10:45 a.m. to 12 p.m.
 - · Classes last 1h10 and not 55 minutes.
 - · Music and Art are always subjects taught in high school.

Everyday life:

- · When I arrived something surprised me, the door locks are in the other direction and it's very disturbing at first.
 - · In their house, Finns often have saunas like in my correspondent's house.
 - · My host family explained to me that even under -25°C they still go to class.
 - · Their breakfast is often salty because the sweet is quite expensive. (Sandwichs)
 - · They eat a little all when they want the meals are only very few all together.
- · Life is much safer there, there is no pocket peak. Alisa told me that one day she had forgotten her computer, her phone and her headphones in a café and when she went back, business had not moved and everything was there. In museums, for example, people pause at the entrance of their coats and other things on coat racks accessible to all and nothing is stolen. The mentality is different
- · Summer is quite complicated because they have days without night and in summer at a certain time the sea is toxic and you should not go there. The Baltic Sea.
 - · In winter there are black days and people are often depressed during this period.
 - · Prices are also displayed in Kr on the labels, in Swedish crown.

Saturday: I got up and had the pleasant surprise to see the all-white landscape. Then I took the train at 9:50 a.m. to go to Helsinki with Alisa and her friends. In Helsinki we had a small snack and went to a natural history museum. After that we went shopping until 5:40 p.m. the time of our return train.


Sunday: we walked in the forest still snowy the day before.

Monday: first day in class and classes are different phones are allowed during classes but some prohibit it. There is a 15-minute break between each class and they only have 30 minutes to eat lunch. Their lunch is between 10:30 a.m. and 12 p.m. and several groups come and eat. At 2:20 p.m. we had "welcome at school" and we have the director of the establishment as well as Hanna to talk to us about our feelings etc. as well as our schedules that we were able to modify in order to have our classes together with Toscane, around typical Finnish products such as salty licorice or typical chips.

Tuesday: I got up with the pleasant surprise of 18 centimeters of snow. We had music, always present in high school, and then we had Spanish then Art where we began work on the architecture of Morlaix.

After classes we went to the subway with the friends of my correspondent as well as the correspondent from Toscane.





Wednesday: I woke up at 8 a.m. to go to high school to attend our first Finnish class where we learned new words. Then we had music and then we went to see, Tuscany and I, my correspondent doing a theater rehearsal. To enjoy the last day of snow we made a snowman.

Thursday: the snow has almost completely disappeared. We started our day with math (we didn't understand everything) then we had art where we continued to make our slideshow on the architecture of Morlaix.




We ate and then we had Spanish who was interrupted by a demonstration by the students against the payment of the school if I understood correctly. Our last course was English where we were able to speak and understand more easily. Finally we went with Hanna to the salo electronics museum (Salo old city at the heart of the first telecommunications production) we were able to learn about a typical Salo brand: the salora brand. And finally we went back to each other's house.



Friday: we arrived for 10:45 a.m. to eat and then we followed our day of class. After classes we went with our correspondents to the city.

Saturday: We went to Turku to shop with the Toscane host family.



Sunday: We went to the Heureka museum with Toscane and we spent our afternoon there we were able to see illusions of interactive activities etc.

Monday: we presented our project on the architecture of Morlaix and we ended our day with a walk in a National Park where we grilled sausages with the Toscane correspondent as well as Hanna and the high school French teacher.



Tuesday: I started at 9:30 a.m. and we started with music. On this day of "far" Vapuu the spring festival there was music of balloons etc. Very colorful and decorated day.

Wednesday: Wednesday was Vapuu I got up and drank Sima drinks typical of Vapuu which is only drunk on this occasion. After this we went to a friend of my correspondent with whom we ate monki traditional vapuu cake also that looks like a sugar donut. In the evening we went to friends of Alisa's parents with whom we celebrated Vapuu again around a barbecue and under the sun.






